 - (even less ones)
- They often use a search engine
- They get a pointer to Wikipedia
- Happy with what they get

Why limit interactions?

- Open Government Data (more later)
- Unexpected reuse
 - Third party applications
 - eg: FixMyStreet, Follow the Money, MapLight, OpenCongress, GovTrack, TheyWorkForYou
- From Chicagocrime to London Met Police Crime Maps

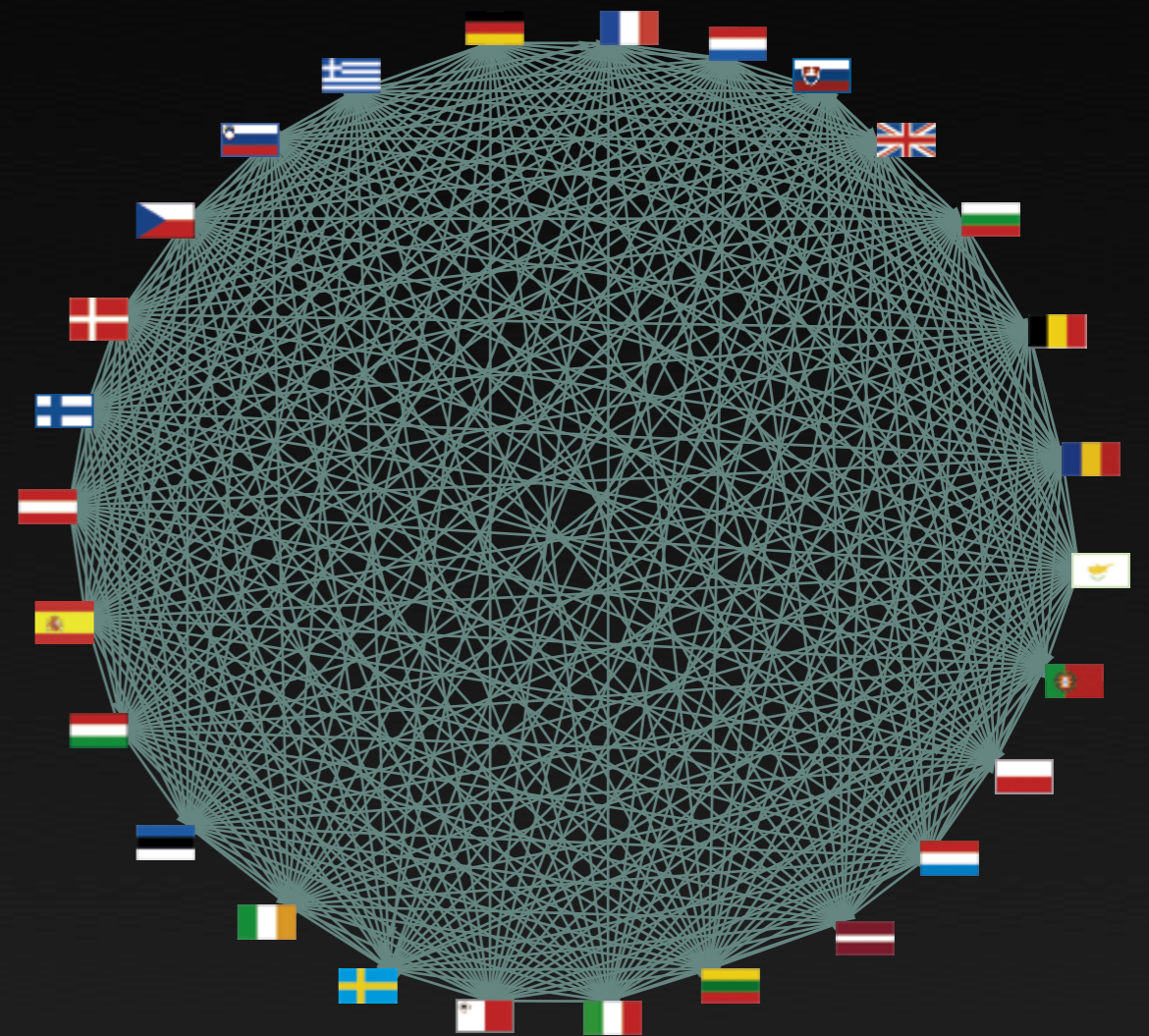
Data Integration

- Trust-related challenges

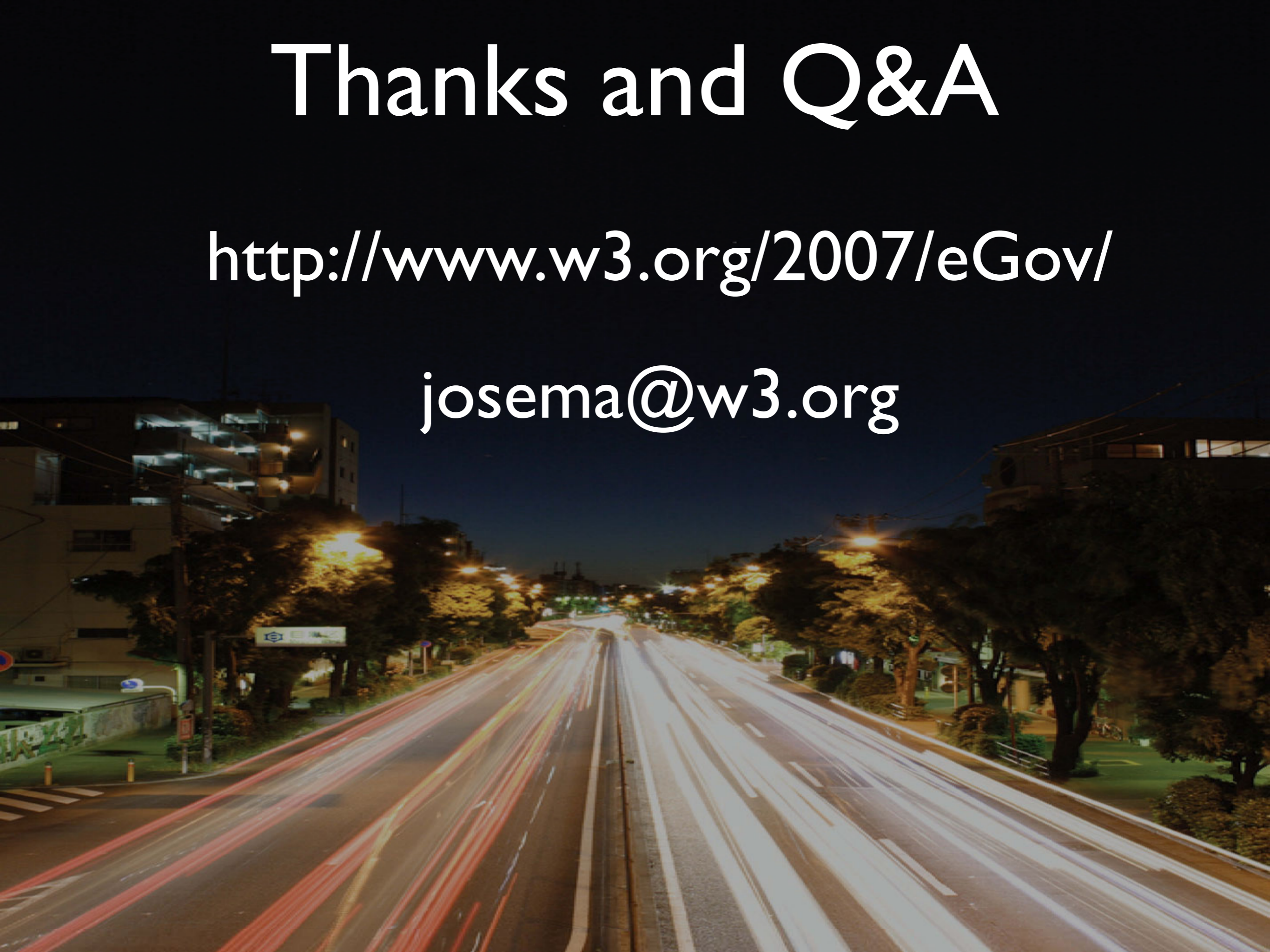
eGovernment IG at W3C
